Learn-By-Heart Catechism...

Sacrament of the Altar, LSB 327

What is the benefit of this eating and drinking?

These words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," show us that
in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given us through
these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and
salvation.

How can bodily eating and drinking do such great things?

Certainly not just eating and drinking do these things, but the words written
here: "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins."

These words, along with the bodily eating and drinking, are the main thing in
the Sacrament. Whoever believes these words has exactly what they say:
"forgiveness of sins."

return to the way of righteousness. Grant faithfulness to all who are admitted
into the fellowship of Christ's Church that they may avoid whatever is contrary
